
Bing Miller drops his Exeter opponent in straight games.

Bob Wurster was the star, as he has been all season, ringing up 45 points. Sawyer totaled 29, and Glenn Greenberg came through with many steals, timely rebounds, and a great job of containing Dick Gribble, the Exeter center and captain.

Andover grabbed a quick 4-0 lead, before the Exies got rolling and poured in ten straight points. But the Blue fought back and managed a 23-21 margin after one frame. The second period was quite even except for one Andover spurt which was promptly repulsed by the Red. The first half ended with the score 50-47 in PA's favor.

With 35 seconds to go in the game, after Sawyer and Wurster had kept the Blue even with unerring shooting for the entire second half, the alert Red team gained a 97-94 lead. Sawyer came through again and cut the margin down to one point with a jump shot. Then he scored what proved to be the clincher when he intercepted a pass and put in a layup. PEA called time out with 15 seconds left.

With two seconds left, the score 98-97 Blue, a jump ball was called under the Exie basket. Everyone thought the game was over; stands emptied onto the court cheering wildly; players were hoisted onto shoulders. Stempson Leads Milers In Red Loss

Wednesday, March 4 — An inspired but outclassed Andover track team was defeated by a perennially strong Exeter squad, 59 1/3 to 26 2/3. The Blue took 3 of 10 events, winning the 600, 1000, and mile.

Red co-captain Bill Grad led Exeter with three individual firsts and also anchored the winning 8 lap relay team. Grad set meet records in the 50 yard dash and 45 yard high hurdles. He also copped the broad jump, leaping over 22 feet.

Exeter football star Carter Lord was another outstanding Red captured the shot put with a cage and meet record toss of 59' 1 3/4". Then he came back to finish a very close second in the 50.

Andover's distance line-up was shaken up at the last minute because of Dick Howe's absence, putting Stempson into the mile.

In the 1000, Martin Panter set a slow pace but resisted the challenge of Exeter's Dave Crowell to win by 10 yards in 2:23.4. Surprising upper Fred Wulsin, a late entry, held on to take third in 2:28.3.

The mile run was the most exciting race of the afternoon. Going into the last lap, Stempson led a sprinting Willeman by about a

foot. As he went past the first turn, Willeman pushed Stempson off the track, trying to pass on the outside. However, Stempson held on to break the tape in 4:29.9, his best time of the season. Willeman was disqualified for his last lap tactics.

Blue captain Jeff Huvelle won the 600 as expected, followed by Jim Chestnut.

In the pole vault, Andover's Colby Snyder and Les Jones cleared 12' 6", along with 2 Exies. However, Bill Hollan of the Red broke the deadlock, going over 13 feet.

Two Andover "A" Club B-Ball teams were overcome in quick succession on their home courts by red-jerseyed visitors from the north.

The lecherous Playboys were overcome by some big moose, name unknown, who lumbered along the baseline and threw up 32 points in the 50-34 contest.

Outstanding for the "Heffies" were Tom "The Bomb" Bottonari and gaunt Sonny Gaunt.

Saturday, March 7 — The Andover varsity swimming team washed Exeter, 56-39, to avenge last year's 55-40 loss to the Red. The team, plagued by trouble with turns and lane markings, did not measure up to previous times, but did set three new Andover-Exeter records and one new school record.

The best performance of the day was turned in by Jim Anderson of Exeter. His 1:55.0 in the two hundred and 4:15.0 in the four hundred set new Exeter and Andover-Exeter records.

The other double winner was Jack Sartore, with a 23.3 in the fifty and a 51.0 in the hundred, both setting new Andover-Exeter records.

Andover jumped to an early 7-0 lead with the medley relay winning by an eight-second margin. Anderson closed the gap to six with his win in the two hundred.

The Blue then took the next three firsts, and after the dive set 27-16.

Lower Jon Noll led the first of Andover's two sweeps with a record-breaking 58.2 in the hundred, putting the Blue within four points of victory. A second and third behind Anderson in the four hundred gave PA the magic 48 points and victory.

Andover's second sweep, in the hundred breast, padded the victory. The Redmen saved themselves a complete disgrace by salvaging a disputed win in the final 100.
