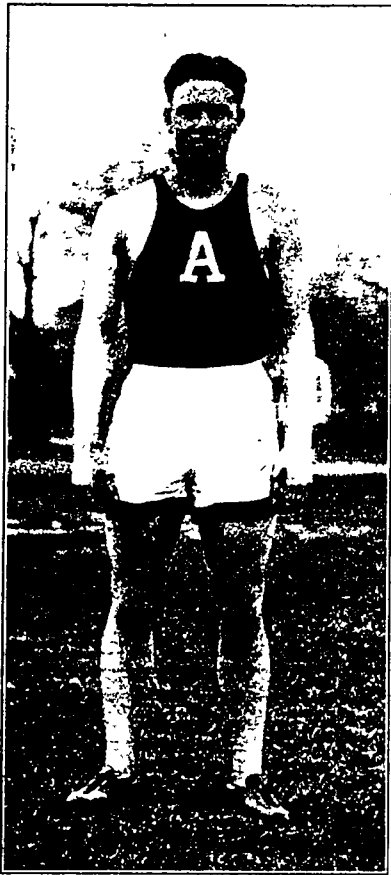




## EXETER AND ANDOVER CLASH TOMORROW IN THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL TRACK MEET

### Blue again Favored to Win, although Red and Grey has Many More Stars than in Other Years. Andover's Present Record Much More Promising

Andover is once more favored to win in the thirty-fourth annual track meet with Exeter tomorrow on Brothers Field. This year the score will be much closer than that of the last few years, for Exeter has numerous stars ably seconded by a group of seasoned athletes, as has also Andover. But the Blue has on its side the fact that Andover has won for the last six years and that this year's team is as powerful as many of those six previous teams; whereas Exeter knows that a group of athletes equal to its present group has been unsuccessful against its ancient rival. However, overconfidence is as much a handicap as underconfidence, and the Blue will have to fight just this frame of mind. Comparison between the teams by means of mutual opponents points largely towards an Andover victory; but the Red and Grey have been recently strengthened by two stars, Ramsay and Lane, the former an entry in five events. Andover is considerably crippled by the loss of French, Woodward, and perhaps Moore. In fact, if Moore is not able to compete, Andover will lose ten sure points which will in all probability even up the score to such an extent that the meet will hinge on the last few events.

While the first team was practicing on the Haverhill course in preparation for the Exeter match, the second squad spent Wednesday afternoon taking the Haverhill High team into camp. The final count was 8 to 1, the lone Haverhill victory being scored in the first singles encounter.

Dinsmore proved to be the star of the meet, winning handily and making the lowest score of the day. The other Andover star was T. Page, who played consistently and steadily throughout.

In the opening contest of the meet, McBrien defeated Russell by a margin of 4 and 2. Russell drove splendidly but otherwise his game was rather uncertain and unsteady. Dinsmore playing excellently and putting well-nigh perfectly overcame his opponent by a count of 2 and 1. The Blue man scored a 38 on the last nine holes.

Neill then won 4-2. His adversary was a hard fighter and the match was never a walkaway. Neill, like Dinsmore, was a letter man last year, playing against Exeter.

Parsons also won. The Haverhill man was Goravity; and the score at the end stood 2 up and 1 to go. The match was very close, but if Parsons had capitalized all his opportunities the end would have come much sooner.

T. Page turned in a fine performance when he conquered Noonan 5-4. H. Page won also, by a score of 4-3.

As the Blue golfers won all the foursomes, the match turned into a rout.

### Home Team Leads in Field

#### Clean Sweeps Expected in Hammer, Broad Jump, Pole Vault

#### TWO-TWENTY DASH LOW HURDLES, HALF MILE-UNCERTAIN

Andover is favored in the one hundred yard dash with King, Osborne, and F. H. Lindenberg against Kollmeyer, Pike, and Tobitt for Exeter. The first two Andover men have done ten flat, whereas Kollmeyer's best time is ten and three-fifths seconds. The other entries have never done better than ten four, but Lindenberg has shown great improvement in the past season and may turn in extremely good time tomorrow.

The outcome of the two hundred twenty yard dash is doubtful. Kollmeyer and Blackman of Exeter will compete against Osborne, Williams, and either Lindenberg or King. In the Harvard Interscholastics Kollmeyer beat Osborne to the tape in this event by passing him in the last five yards. Both these contestants have done twenty-three seconds or better and, therefore, this race should be a close one, worthy of eulogy.

Ramsay, the Red and Grey's hope in the one hundred and twenty yard low hurdles, has done, as his fastest time, seventeen and three-fifths seconds, whereas C. W. Williamson has run this event in sixteen and one-fifth seconds. Therefore, it appears as though Andover will easily capture first place. Pitkin for the Blue and Kahn for the Red and Grey will fight it out for third place.

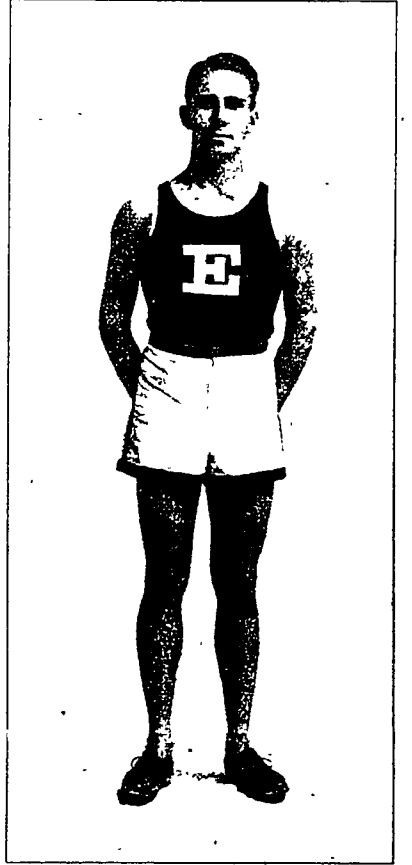
Although Wright has done three fifths of a second faster in the two hundred twenty yard low hurdles than Kahn of Exeter, the latter placed second in this event at the Harvard Stadium, whereas Wright came in fourth. If the Andover entry is in good form, he should win and thus earn the letter which he lost last year because of a fall at the last hurdle. Ramsay also stars in this event and should give the Blue entry trouble.

The outcome of the quarter-mile run can scarcely be prophesied, for Lane and Coombs of Exeter will fight it out for first place with Pew of Andover. Both Lane and Pew have done fifty-three and three-fifths seconds, and thus it may depend on the start as to who will hit the tape first. O'Kane has also turned in fast time and may defeat Coombs, thus taking third.

If French is in shape for the half-mile tomorrow, he should win it easily for he has done four seconds faster than Collins, Exeter's best man, and beat him decisively in the Interscholastics. However, it is more than likely that he will not be able to run. In this case, Page will be Andover's hope. He has never done better than two minutes and

seven seconds but he clips off several of these each time he runs. Robinson and Hyatt for Exeter and Chase and Hoag for Andover will run it out for third with Chase a slight favorite.

Bonthron of Exeter has turned in four minutes and thirty-nine seconds in the mile, one second faster than Duchesne's record. He is favored also for the reason that he defeated Duchesne in the Harvard Stadium by a few yards. But the Andover entry is improving, and this race should be a fight to the finish. Rolfe is greatly favored to take third. Hotchkiss and Keppel will be the other Exeter entries and Chickering will be the third man for the Blue.

The javelin will probably be the hardest contest of the afternoon, for Captain Goodell of Exeter and Keesling of the home team are almost on a par. Goodell has done better officially, but Keesling has made the better distance in practice. The Exeter entry defeated Andover's man in the Interscholastics by two and one-half feet. Captain Houston of Andover should take third easily, but he may be pressed by Murray for the Blue and Osgood and Burgess for the Red and Grey.

Andover is a very heavy favorite in the hammer and is expected to score nine points in this event. McDougall, Brunner, and Kidder all do consistently over one hundred fifty-five feet, whereas Bourgeois, Exeter's best man, has never

done more than one hundred and forty-three feet. Johnson and Reid will be the Red and Grey's other entries, but neither man is much of a threat.

Exeter is weakened in the discus by the loss of Snedeker, who would have been a sure winner since he does one hundred and thirty-five feet regularly. However, Johnson has done one hundred and twenty-two feet and will probably give Brunner, Houston, and Viviano much trouble. Nevertheless, if the Blue entries are in good form, this event may be another clean sweep for Andover.

Andover is also favored to win both first and second in the shot-put, since Captain Houston and Jackson do over forty-six feet, which the Red and Grey's man, Byron, has never done. Exeter will also enter Tuttle and Langford, but these men do not do farther than forty-four feet, so they are not very threatening opponents. Andover has numerous other shot-putters, but it is very unlikely that

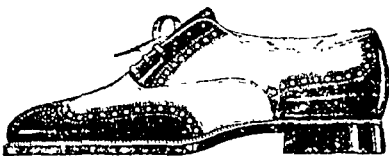

any of them will be in the Varsity meet.

In the broad jump, it is dependent on Moore which Andover men will place. If this star is absent, Reed, C. W. Williamson, and Churchill should win in that order; but if Moore is jumping, Churchill will enter the second team meet. Pike, Exeter's best entry, does only nineteen feet eight inches, so can hardly be expected to place, thus making a clean sweep for Andover in this event almost certain.

Moore should easily win the high jump if he is able to compete; it is uncertain whether he will or not, for he has spent the past week in the Infirmary. Marsh of Andover is a slight favorite over Blackman and Ramsay even though Blackman beat the Blue's entry in the Interscholastics. However, this place was won at five feet seven and Marsh cleared five feet nine against Worcester, so he should come out on top. Wright of Andover and Scheffy of Exeter will be the other men in this event.

Andover is perhaps surer of winning nine points in the pole vault than in any other event, since four men vault over eleven feet six inches and Exeter does only eleven or less. Brown, Pierce, and Pickett will endeavor to score a clean sweep for the Blue, and Ramsay, Walsh and Woodberry will try to prevent it. But Ramsay is the only man who can do over ten-six, and he will have competed in four events before this one. Therefore the fresh Andover men should not have much trouble in attaining their nine points.
